Introduction

A range of one off learning activities were held during Adult Learner's week, giving people the opportunity to have a go at a short piece of learning and find out about future learning opportunities in their community.

Activities undertaken during reporting period

- 3 x Defibrillation & Resuscitation training sessions 28 attendees in total
- 2 x Dementia Friends training sessions 24 attendees in total
- 1 x ALW Celebration event 14 attendees

We also planned first aid, and motivational 'Steps to Success' courses but these we cancelled due to a lack of demand.

Outcomes the project has contributed to

Local residents are have better skills regarding resuscitation, use of a defibrillator and spotting dementia and offering support. These are not only skills that are valuable and could be put to good use in the community, but would also enhance an individual's CV. Through the celebration event at the Children's Centre, those not yet engaged in adult learning were able to see the achievement of others and gain an understanding of the different types of training available, and the support on offer such as childcare and help with course fees.

Timescales

The project ran to time.

Plans for next reporting period

Requests were made for more defib training – this is being looked into. Vision WNC are running an 'Understanding Special Needs Course' at the Children's Centre. BW can support with childcare costs if requited. Plans to run a door supervisors course are being explored further.
